Welcome to BOSTON

An historic market town centered around a stunning market place, Boston makes an ideal day out – and the perfect place to base yourself for a short break to the area.



Set in the heart of Lincolnshire's dramatic Fenland, Boston is steeped in history. The tower of 'The Stump' (St. Botolph's Church) can be seen from miles around and is a must visit. Nearby, Boston Guildhall is a magnificent Medieval building built in the 1390s – now a fascinating visitor attraction.

Boston's importance as a port was second only to London. Much of the rich history of the town is still evident today. Take the walking tour on page 14 & 15 to explore further.

Wednesday and Saturdays are market days and an ideal time to visit Boston. The Medieval Lanes are now filled with independent

shops. And many of your favourite High Street stores can be found in Pescod Square – the town's main shopping area.

An eclectic mix of English and European restaurants and cafes mean there are plenty of choices of places to eat. For evening entertainment, look out for events at Blackfriars Theatre and Arts Centre.

Around Boston you'll find yet more heritage with Hussey Tower, two RSPB Nature Reserves (Freiston Shore and Frampton Marsh), waterways – and within easy reach is the coastal resort of Skegness.

We hope you discover and explore Boston. Enjoy your visit.

The Skyline of Boston depicted on the front cover has been developed as a part of the Heritage Lottery Funded project Explore and Discover which will help orientate and engage people in Boston's wide offer. Lincolnshire County Council and Boston Borough Council have also contributed to this project.

Fyde House

is a Grade 1 listed Georgian town house. Nikolaus Pevsner's architectural guide describes it as "undoubtedly the grandest house in town."

Portraits, prints and photographs within the rooms show some of the history associated with Fyde House built in the early 1700s.

Visit Fyde House free to learn about the history of the house and the people who have lived there.

Look around the rooms or discover more with the help of one of the friendly volunteers. Step out into the beautiful walled garden.

Now home of the *Boston Preservation Trust* who saved the house in 1934, and also home to the History of Boston Project and the new *Boston Hanse Group*.

The garden and house are associated with *Sir Joseph Banks*, Recorder of Boston and will be open for a special day on June 1st 2016

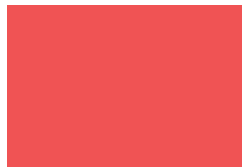


HAVENSIDE COUNTRY PARK & PILGRIM FATHERS MEMORIAL

BOSTON GUILDHALL MUSEUM

600 years of history

Boston is the proud winner of the gold award in the large towns category of The RHS East Midlands in Bloom competition in 2015 - a nationwide initiative. As you walk the Boston in Bloom trail you will see an array of flora, enhancing the beauty of this historic town.



Pilgrim Fathers

The Pilgrim Fathers sought to make their first escape bid to another land from the Lincolnshire coast, close to Scotia Creek at Fishtoft near Boston - where a memorial now stands. In 1607 they were betrayed, arrested and locked up in the Guildhall. They planned to escape from religious persecution and their crime was seeking to leave the country without the permission of the King. You can see the courtroom and the cells where Brewster, Bradford and others were imprisoned when you visit the Guildhall.

The iconic Gliderdrome

Boston's iconic Gliderdrome opened in the mid-thirties as an open air skating rink. It quickly became a popular venue for American and British servicemen for dancing.

The golden era of the 60's saw performances by top artists including Elton John, Stevie Wonder, Thin Lizz & many more. The venue still hosts events - & the nostalgia lives on!

Hanseatic League

Boston was a significant trading town in the 13th century when the port was thriving - trading with towns and cities throughout the North and Baltic Seas. Because of its importance - Boston was part of the Hanseatic league.

700 years on, in 2015 - Boston rejoined the Hanseatic League to support economic growth in the region, attract tourists and enhance links with the 183 member towns and cities.



Nature on your doorstep: Witham Way Country Park

Witham Way Country Park and Nature Reserve runs alongside the River Witham close to the town centre and provides a wide range of habitats, including woodland, scrub, wildflower meadow, orchard and bug park

MARKETS

Boston's sweeping market place is the heart of the town - and has been so for centuries. Once one of the wealthiest trading ports, second only to London, Boston's commercial centre still holds regular markets today.

Wednesday and Saturday are the main market days, where you'll find traders selling local produce, fashion, household items and much more - you can also grab a bargain at the regular auction on Bargate Green. Market days are really vibrant and a great day to plan your visit to the town - the largest open air markets in Lincolnshire.

Boston Markets

Boston's open air markets are the largest in Lincolnshire and have been held for hundreds of years. The markets take place every Wednesday and Saturday in the historic, recently redeveloped Market Place. On Wednesdays there are additional stalls on Bargate Green, alongside an auction which sells a wide variety of items including plants and garden ornaments, toys and games, musical instruments and furniture.



Boston Craft Market begins on Thursday 12th May and will stand every other week in the Market Place selling a range of hand made goods. There will also be a series of Vintage markets this year, the first of these will be held in the Market Place on Sunday 24th April. A mixture of vintage goods including clothing, homeware and collectibles will be available.

Overlooking the Market Place is St Botolph's Church, which has one of the tallest towers in the UK; providing visitors with wonderful views across the fens. Just a short walk away is Boston Guildhall Museum which was built in the 1390's for the Guild of St Mary. Visitors can learn all about this medieval building and its many uses over the years; including the trial and imprisonment of the Pilgrim Fathers which took place there in 1607.

Whilst visiting Boston, why not explore some of the many surrounding lanes with their cosy cafes and independent eateries.

A HERITAGE WALKING TOUR OF BOSTON

This route of historical interest that takes in most of Boston's landmarks is marked on the map overleaf. We start at the market place.

MARKET PLACE

From one of England's finest market places you will notice the frontage of the buildings and the narrow lanes reflecting the medieval layout of the town. On the West side is the grand Exchange Building - built in 1772 to house the council offices after the Guildhall was vacated.



FYDELL HOUSE, next to the Guildhall was owned by the Fydell family from 1726. Thomas Fydell was a close friend of one of Lincolnshire's most famous sons, explorer and naturalist, Sir Joseph Banks. An armillary sphere and engraved poem dedicated to him can be found in the garden.

SHODFRIARS HALL is a large ornately-timbered building on South Street. Look over the road to **CUSTOM HOUSE QUAY**. This area was the hub of the busy medieval port with cargo vessels tied up alongside the quay discharging their cargoes.



THE GUILDHALL dates from 1390, originally the Hall of St Mary's Guild. Following the granting of a Charter of Incorporation to the town in 1545 by Henry VIII, the Guildhall became the first Town Hall for the Corporation. You will find a museum and the Tourist Information Centre inside.

THE SALVATION ARMY CITADEL was built in 1899. This was the childhood home of Catherine (Mumford) Booth, co-founder of the Salvation Army.

THE STUMP & CANDLE public house sits on the site of the birthplace of John Foxe the martyrologist, who was born there in 1517. One of Boston's most important figures, he wrote the famous 'Book of Martyrs', published in 1563. The book helped to influence the establishment of the Church of England.



Back to the market place and **ST. BOTOLPHS CHURCH** - known affectionately as the Stump. Building of the church started in 1309 and was completed in approximately 1510. The 272 feet high tower is been a landmark across the surrounding countryside. Interior features include the magnificent pulpit known as Cotton's Pulpit from which Rev. John Cotton Vicar of St Botolph's began his preaching in 1612.

THE CUSTOMS HOUSE, opposite the quay displays the Royal Coat of Arms and is believed to be one of the oldest Custom Houses in the country.

At the far end of the quay is a converted grain warehouse **THE SAM NEWSON CENTRE**, now with a fine auditorium with excellent acoustics.

BLACKFRIARS THEATRE & ARTS CENTRE on Spain Lane, housed in the remains of a Dominican Friary. This is the oldest building in the town.

THE WHITE HART HOTEL on the bank of the River Haven, looks down stream to the Grand Sluice which divides the fresh water River Witham from the tidal, salt water of the Haven.

THE ASSEMBLY ROOMS were built in 1822. The space in front, known as Fish Hill was once where fish merchants occupied part of the ground floor.

Outside of the Stump is the **HERBERT INGRAM** statue, born in Boston in 1811 and MP for the Borough from 1856-1860. He founded The Illustrated London News and was responsible for bringing piped water to Boston.

SHOPPING



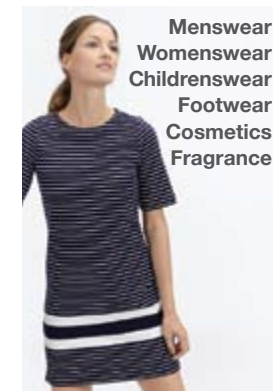
A thriving market town, Boston has the perfect combination of independent shops and high street names.

more convenient. Medieval Lanes branch off from the market place and are lined with small boutiques, places to eat and specialist stores. And in the West Street area you'll find a fabulous mix of Eastern European restaurants and shops.

On route to Boston retail park where you'll find further national retailers - you pass through Wide Bargate - pop into Cammacks and Coneys - and along Pen Street you'll find quirky and high end boutiques. The Magpies Nest on Church Street is an absolute must for collectors of antiques and the Sack Store for a range of special interiors with a charming coffee shop.

Boston's most well known shopping has to be the market. Visit on a Wednesday and Saturday for the largest markets in Lincolnshire.

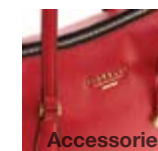
